Every year, the world pauses on September 21st to celebrate the International Day of Peace, a moment dedicated to reflecting on the value of harmony, cooperation, and global unity. 

HRC, you deserve a place on the podium as well. The bows, the textures, the pearls! Good job!




So cute GA1. The gossip box was filled with love, from the inside, to the outside. However it is a little too simple.

With recently intensified fighting around the recently captured by the RSF cities of Bara and El Fasher, Sudan's ongoing civil war has escalated into a regional crisis, threatening not only the nation itself but also its neighbors and global energy markets. The brutal power struggle between the Sudanese Armed Forces (SAF) and the






Rapid Support Forces (RSF) has intensified, turning what began as a domestic conflict into a transnational humanitarian disaster. Since the overthrow of long-time ruler Omar al-Bashir in 2019, Sudan has struggled to transition toward stable governance. Instead, political disputes have been militarized, and paramilitary groups have gained unprecedented power.

#### HRC

A massive chemical spill in the Democratic Republic of the Congo has unleashed a nation-wide emergency. Late on the night of November 22nd, a containment tank at a cobalt mine in the Lualaba province burst open, releasing over 150,000 liters of acidic mine waste, into the nearby river that thousands rely on for everyday activities. Within hours, locals including children, many of which were miners under child labor themselves, were reported to suffer severely from vomiting, burns and breathing difficulties.


